2019-2022 Allocations

- •2019-2020 DESE Allotment =\$1,045,884 (included one-time increase in funding toward transportation and new staff)
- •2020-2021 DESE Allotment =\$973, 658 (level funded budget; did not reflect the same increase in operating expenses as previous year!)
- •2021-2022 DESE Allotment = \$1,046,813 (included funding increase for operating expenses)
- •Increase of **\$73,155** from 2020-2021

Wayland METCO Updates/Highlights, 2019-present

2019-2020

- •Hired **two Academic Coaches** for (18) Boston resident students enrolled in the after school Middle School BASE Program.
- Hired second Elementary bus monitor.
- •Hired second Elementary METCO Coordinator (Wayland METCO alumnus).
- Began funding the part of the Director Equity and Belonging/ Academic Dean position.
- •Held *inaugural* Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. program and dinner *in Boston* (Keynote: Pastor Matthew K. Thompson of Jubilee Church & Wayland METCO alumnus, Class of '90). The event drew over 200 people.
- •Nominated two Boston resident Wayland High School seniors for the Biomedical Science Careers Student Conference at Harvard University.

2019-2020 — continued

- •Nominated **three Boston resident students**, who took part in the Massachusetts Partnership for Youth Inc. Leadership Middle School Conference, at Lasell University.
- •One Wayland High School Boston resident student was the first recipient selected for the prestigious Island School \$10,000 scholarship to study in the Bahamas for the summer.
- Co-facilitated in the selection of the new Boston Parent Executive Board.
- •Helped a Wayland High School Boston resident student secure a 4-year 125K Dean Scholarship to enroll at Wheaton College.
- •Launched a pilot program that matched **8 Wayland High School juniors** with an Academic Coach to help them complete their college statement of purposes prior to their senior year!
- •In collaboration with district staff and Wayland families, held a very successful parade of cars congratulatory event for graduating seniors in Boston.

2020-2021

- •Launched a summer Math Academy pilot program for (3) middle school students who needed additional academic support prior to entering 7th grade, which was led by middle school teacher.
- •Placed **26 K-12 students**, the largest number of prospective Boston resident students into Wayland Public Schools during my tenure.
- •Funded weekly online, one-on-one academic tutoring for 29 K-12 students through ACLC.
- •Held the **first virtual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. program and dinner** (Keynote: Michael Bobbitt). The event drew over 200 people.
- •Renamed the "Diversity Room" at Wayland High School to "The Trailblazer Room" in honor of Wayland METCO's first graduate, Mr. Elliott Francis, Class of 1971.

2020-2021- continued

- •Co-planned with Boston Parent Council **a senior dinner where \$26,000 in scholarships** was awarded to several college-bound students.
- •Helped a Wayland High School Boston resident student secure **a 4-year 140K Trustee Scholarship** to enroll at Wheaton College.
- •Held a **cultural bus tour of communities in Boston for Wayland, Boston residents, and their caregivers** that received several news coverage. The event was funded by the Boston Bridges Initiative.
- •Selected two middle school students to participate in The Calculus Project over the summer.
- •Funded 10 K-12 students to receive one-on-one academic tutoring from ACLC in the summer.

2021-2022

- •Hired new METCO Elementary Coordinator when one of my staff took a new position in the district.
- •Fund weekly online, one-on-one academic tutoring for 29 K-12 students through ACLC.
- •Held the **second virtual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. program and dinner** (Keynote speakers: Gloria Harrison-Hall and Carrie Clifford, Wayland alumna, Class of 1989). The event drew close to 200 people.
- •In partnership with Wayland families, provided 22 turkey baskets with Stop & Shop gift cards to Boston resident families.
- •Established new partnership with Montserrat College of Art to offer **three full tuition and room scholarships** to METCO student across all 33 partner districts to attend the summer pre-college program. One Wayland Boston resident student has applied.
